And it is just a confidence issue because when you know that there is no enlightenment... because the one who knows fullness and emptiness obtains... and that I have been free the whole time, all that is left to do is reorient the mind into knowing that it is whole and complete, ordinary, actionless awareness. But, and here's the real kicker, the one who knows that the mind needs to reorient itself... me, awareness... is already oriented, being the essence of everything, and all that is left is the undeniable truth that I have, will and will always persist as the self. This is the beauty of knowledge.

It is so simple really because it is just a simple object/subject discrimination (*sat-asat-viveka*) regarding who I really am. Therefore I, the subject, am free of the object. The object is wholly dependent on me, that is, the world exists because I do; I am free of the world.

But what Vedanta showed Paul is that even if ignorance is there I still am and always will be pure knowledge, free of ignorance. How can a reflection bite the person?!
